SPRING/BREAK Art Show TIMES SQUARE IMMERSIVE, featuring Devra Freelander and Gracelee

Lawrence, ICY and SOT, Noah Scalin, and Michael Zelehoski. The exuberant exhibition platform sprawls onto the Broadway plazas with four sculptures that blur reality and fantasy with delight and warning.

Peter Campus Head of a Sad Young Woman, presented with The Bronx Museum of the Arts, The Armory Show, and Cristin Tierney Gallery. The seminal video artist studies the exchange between subject, viewer, and artist through a psychological portrait of a melancholy young woman whose monumental gaze towers over Times Square.

RaFia Dizzillusions. In this spritely, looping video, the artist's digitally painted portrait floats against a background of psychedelic waves and vibrating, color-shifting shapes, reflecting the sensorial overload of city living.

Petra Cortright *Pink_Para_1stchoice*, presented with Rhizome. The artist performs in front of a webcam using filters and editing techniques to draw out an endless, accordion-like flow of her movements — the first Midnight Moment created with and for the computer screen.
